BPC COMMENTS:

Bishopsteignton Parish Council object to the proposal due to overdevelopment in its prominent position on the road which could be detrimental to the street scene; members feel the overall look maybe out of character. The council are aware that some vegetation, shrubs and hedging has been removed to allow for this development prior to any response to the application therefore it requests that if the officer has in mind to grant permission that some conditions are added which ensure a sympathetic and softening landscaping scheme is incorporated to minimise the impact on the street scene.

In addition, concerns were raised, and disappointed felt, that the proposed work has been ongoing since early in the winter and is now close to finished despite the application still only being in the consultation stage. This matter will be raised separately by Bishopsteignton Parish Council with the TDC Planning Enforcement Officer.
